ADD TO YOUR ANTIDEPRESSANT with REXULTI

If you're still experiencing depression symptoms on an antidepressant, **add-on REXULTI could help.**

INDICATION:

REXULTI is a prescription medicine used along with antidepressant medicines to treat major depressive disorder (MDD) in adults. It is not known if REXULTI is safe and effective in children with MDD.

- Increased risk of suicidal thoughts and actions. REXULTI and antidepressant medicines may increase suicidal thoughts and actions in
 pediatric patients and young adult patients, especially within the first few months of treatment or when the dose is changed. Depression
 and other mental illnesses are the most important causes of suicidal thoughts and actions. All patients on antidepressants and their families
 or caregivers should closely watch for new or worsening depression symptoms, especially sudden changes in mood, behaviors, thoughts,
 or feelings. Report any change in these symptoms immediately to the doctor.

On an antidepressant but still masking your depression? You're not alone.

Many people on antidepressants still experience depression symptoms.

It may be Partial Response, which is when your antidepressant helps, but only partially—and you're still left masking how you really feel.

If you're experiencing Partial Response, talking to your doctor can be a first step toward reducing your symptoms.



Why REXULTI® (brexpiprazole)?

Adding REXULTI may help build on the progress you've made with your antidepressant.

If you're still struggling with depression symptoms after 2 months of taking your antidepressant, it could be time to talk to your doctor about adding REXULTI, an add-on treatment that may help reduce your depression symptoms—without changing your antidepressant.

What were the REXULTI® (brexpiprazole) clinical trials?

REXULTI was studied in two 6-week clinical trials of 1,054 adult patients, aged 18-65, who had been diagnosed with major depressive disorder (MDD).

The patients selected for the studies took an antidepressant for at least 2 months. Patients who then had ongoing symptoms of depression were randomly selected to receive 1 mg to 3 mg/day of REXULTI in addition to their antidepressant. The rest continued taking their antidepressant alone.

What were the results?

At the end of the 6-week clinical trials, researchers discovered something: generally, adult patients whose doctors added REXULTI to their antidepressant showed more improvement than those who continued to take their antidepressant alone.

Could REXULTI work for you?

Not everyone responds to medication the same way. Ask your healthcare provider if adding REXULTI is right for you. On the next page, you'll find out more about getting started on REXULTI.



How to take REXULTI® (brexpiprazole)


REXULTI is taken once daily, with or without food. It's important to ask your pharmacist or doctor if you have any questions about taking **REXULTI**. Take **REXULTI** as your doctor prescribed it:

- Do not change the dose or stop taking REXULTI yourself. Your doctor may change your dose if needed.
- Do not change the dose or stop taking REXULTI without first talking to your doctor.
- Take REXULTI 1 time each day with or without food.
- Do not take REXULTI if you are allergic to brexpiprazole or any of the ingredients in REXULTI. See end of Medication Guide for a complete list of ingredients in REXULTI.

- Problems with your metabolism such as:

Can I take other medications with REXULTI[®] (brexpiprazole)?

Tell your doctor about all of the medicines you take or have recently taken, including prescription and non-prescription medications, vitamins, and herbal supplements. REXULTI and other medicines may affect each other, causing possible serious side effects.

REXULTI may affect the way other medicines work, and other medicines may affect how REXULTI works.

Your healthcare provider can tell you if it's safe to take REXULTI with your other medicines. Don't start or stop any medicines without talking to your healthcare provider first. Only you and your healthcare provider can decide if REXULTI is right for you.

Call your healthcare provider if you have any of these symptoms of high blood sugar during treatment with REXULTI:

feel very thirsty

- need to urinate more than usual
- feel very hungry
- feel sick to your stomach
- feel confused, or your breath smells fruity

feel weak or tired

When will REXULTI start working?

Not everyone responds to medication the same way, and your body may need time to adapt. That's why it's important to share how you are feeling with your healthcare provider, including any side effects.

This way, they will better understand what effect your treatment may be having and make an adjustment if necessary. Always talk to your doctor before making any changes to your treatment.

What are the most common side effects?

The most common side effects associated with REXULTI plus an antidepressant were weight gain and restlessness or feeling like you need to move (akathisia), as reported during 6-week clinical studies of adults with major depressive disorder (MDD).

You and your healthcare provider should check your weight regularly. In 6-week clinical studies of adults with MDD, 7% of patients taking REXULTI plus an antidepressant reported an increase in body weight, compared with 2% of patients taking an antidepressant plus a placebo (nontherapeutic pill).

In the same studies, akathisia was reported by 9% of patients taking REXULTI plus an antidepressant and by 2% of patients taking an antidepressant plus a placebo.

Questions & Answers (Continued)

Will REXULTI® (brexpiprazole) affect my cholesterol?

An increase in the fat levels (cholesterol and triglycerides) in your blood may occur while taking REXULTI. Before starting on REXULTI, discuss with your healthcare provider if you have high levels of cholesterol, triglycerides, or LDL cholesterol, or low levels of HDL cholesterol.

Your healthcare provider should check the fat levels in your blood before you start, or soon after you start REXULTI, and then periodically during treatment with REXULTI.

During clinical trials,* changes in fasting total cholesterol, LDL cholesterol, and HDL cholesterol were similar between adult patients taking REXULTI and patients taking a placebo.

Will REXULTI make me feel sleepy or drowsy?

In clinical trials,* 4% of adult patients who had REXULTI added to an antidepressant experienced drowsiness, compared with 1% of patients taking an antidepressant plus a placebo.

Until you know how REXULTI affects you, do not drive, operate heavy machinery, or do dangerous activities.

 increased fat levels (cholesterol and triglycerides) in your blood. Your healthcare provider should check the fat levels in your blood before you start, or soon after you start REXULTI, and then periodically during treatment with REXULTI.

Could REXULTI affect my blood sugar?

An increase in blood sugar (hyperglycemia) can happen in some people who take REXULTI. Extremely high blood sugar can lead to coma or death.

In clinical studies,* adult patients with shifts in fasting blood sugar from normal (<100 mg/dL) to high (\geq 126 mg/dL) and borderline (\geq 100 mg/dL and <126 mg/dL) to high were similar in patients treated with REXULTI and patients treated with placebo.

Call your healthcare provider if you have any of these symptoms of high blood sugar while taking REXULTI: You feel very thirsty; feel very hungry; feel sick to your stomach; need to urinate more than usual; feel weak or tired; feel confused, or your breath smells fruity.

Will REXULTI make me feel restless?

About 3% of adult patients taking REXULTI plus an antidepressant reported feelings of restlessness during clinical trials,* compared with 0% of patients taking placebo.

Does REXULTI affect sexual function?

Overall, there was no difference seen in sexual function of adult patients as a result of taking REXULTI with an antidepressant compared with those taking an antidepressant alone.

During clinical trials,* adult patients taking REXULTI plus an antidepressant reported their overall sexual function was similar to that of patients taking an antidepressant alone, as measured by the Massachusetts General Hospital Sexual Functioning Questionnaire.

- weight gain. You and your healthcare provider should check your weight before you start and often during treatment with REXULTI.
- Unusual and uncontrollable (compulsive) urges. Some people taking REXULTI have had strong unusual urges, to gamble and gambling that cannot be controlled (compulsive gambling). Other compulsive urges include sexual urges, shopping, and eating or binge eating. If you or your family members notice that you are having new or unusual strong urges or behaviors, talk to your healthcare provider.
- Low white blood cell count. Your healthcare provider may do blood tests during the first few months of treatment with REXULTI.
- Decreased blood pressure (orthostatic hypotension) and fainting. You may feel dizzy, lightheaded or pass out (faint) when you rise too quickly from a sitting or lying position.
- Falls. REXULTI may make you sleepy or dizzy, may cause a decrease in your blood pressure when changing position (orthostatic hypotension), and can slow your thinking and motor skills which may lead to falls that can cause fractures or other injuries.
- Seizures (convulsions).
- Problems controlling your body temperature so that you feel too warm. Do not become too hot or dehydrated during treatment with REXULTI. Do not exercise too much. In hot weather, stay inside in a cool place if possible. Stay out of the sun. Do not wear too much clothing or heavy clothing. Drink plenty of water.
- **Difficulty swallowing** that can cause food or liquid to get into your lungs.

• Sleepiness, drowsiness, feeling tired, difficulty thinking and doing normal activities. Do not drive a car, operate machinery, or do other dangerous activities until you know how REXULTI affects you. REXULTI may make you feel drowsy.

Before taking REXULTI, tell your healthcare provider about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- have or have had heart problems or a stroke
- have or have had low or high blood pressure
- have or have had diabetes or high blood sugar or a family history of diabetes or high blood sugar.
- have or have had high levels of total cholesterol, LDL cholesterol, or triglycerides, or low levels of HDL cholesterol
- have or have had seizures (convulsions)
- have or have had kidney or liver problems
- have or have had a low white blood cell count
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. REXULTI may harm your unborn baby. Taking REXULTI during your third trimester of pregnancy may cause your baby to have abnormal muscle movements or withdrawal symptoms after birth. Talk to your healthcare provider about the risk to your unborn baby if you take REXULTI during pregnancy.
- Tell your healthcare provider if you become pregnant or think you are pregnant during treatment with REXULTI.
- There is a pregnancy exposure registry for women who are exposed to REXULTI during pregnancy. If you become pregnant during treatment with REXULTI, talk to your healthcare provider about registering with the National Pregnancy Registry for Psychiatric Medications. You can register by calling 1-866-961-2388 or visit http://womensmentalhealth.org/ clinical-and-research-programs/pregnancyregistry/.
- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known if REXULTI passes into your breast milk. Talk to your healthcare provider about the best way to feed your baby during treatment with REXULTI.

Tell your healthcare provider about all the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. REXULTI and other medicines may affect each other causing possible serious side effects. REXULTI may affect the way other medicines work, and other medicines may affect how REXULTI works. Your healthcare provider can tell you if it is safe to take REXULTI with your other medicines. Do not start or stop any medicines during treatment with REXULTI without first talking to your healthcare provider.

The most common side effects of REXULTI include weight gain, sleepiness, dizziness, common cold symptoms, and restlessness or feeling like you need to move (akathisia).

These are not all the possible side effects of REXULTI. For more information, ask your healthcare provider or pharmacist.
